MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME


Time Warner Cable Inc. (“TWC”), by its attorneys, hereby requests a brief extension of time, from Tuesday, January 22, 2008, until Tuesday, February 5, 2008, to submit its Answer to the above-captioned program carriage complaint (“Complaint”) filed by Herring Broadcasting, Inc., d/b/a WealthTV (“WealthTV”). TWC notes that it effectively received service of WealthTV’s Complaint on Friday, December 21, 2007, the last business day before the Christmas holiday.¹ Consequently, TWC was hampered in its ability to contact all of the persons with information relevant to formulating its Answer because of the Christmas and New Year’s holidays. In addition, TWC notes that its ability to fully respond to WealthTV’s Complaint has been made more difficult by the fact that one of the key officials identified by WealthTV as having been involved in carriage negotiations, Mr. Mickey Carter, left TWC in the spring of 2007. Finally, only after reviewing the voluminous exhibits to the Complaint did TWC discover that one of the cited exhibits had been omitted from the copies served on TWC.

¹ WealthTV’s counsel advised TWC’s counsel late in the day on Thursday, December 20, 2007, that a copy of the Complaint would be delivered the following day, which indeed was the case. WealthTV’s counsel apparently also sent a copy of the complaint to TWC’s counsel via electronic mail after the close of business on December 20, 2007.

Under the circumstances, the short extension requested will serve the public interest by allowing TWC to formulate a full and complete answer to the Complaint. Moreover, grant of the requested extension will not adversely impact WealthTV, which did not file its Complaint for more than seven months after giving the requisite pre-complaint notice to TWC last May. In this regard, TWC notes that while counsel for WealthTV declined to consent to the instant motion, TWC would not oppose the grant of additional time for WealthTV to file its Reply, should such be requested.


